Partner In An Electrical Appliance Firm Was 55

Services for Ezra Himelfarb, who was a partner in one of the city's oldest electrical appliance businesses, will be conducted at 11 A.M. today at the Levinson funeral establishment, 6010 Reisterstown road.

Mr. Himelfarb died Sunday in the Johns Hopkins Hospital after a long illness. He was 55.

Native Of Baltimore

He was born in Baltimore and was graduated in 1936 from the University of Baltimore with a Bachelor of Laws degree. After serving in the 105th Infantry of the Maryland National Guard, he joined his brothers in the family business.

He was a partner in that firm until his death.

He was a Mason and belonged to the Jewish War Veterans.
